WHAT IS 2009? IS IT JUST BACK IN OH-NINE? CAN THIS YEAR BE CONTENT TO SIT AMONG OTHER MONETARY UNITS, EQUAL IN MEASURE AND ONLY SLIGHTLY DIFFERENT IN LENGTH?

NO, I THINK NOT. The first year of Obama's presidency, thirty years after the first *Star Trek*, twenty-five since the first Video Music Awards and the first Mac, a decade since Napster and three months after Hurricane Ike, 2009 will not be simple, plain or average. We're sifting through the stuff that will wallpaper the rest of the century. No one's gonna remember T.I. or James Franco but something will get through. Hell, it might be you. Like previous booms of printing presses, recording studios and film companies we're sitting in the midst of an explosion of written material and social interaction that will shape the world into something that would've been unrecognizable in the 20th century.

Alison de Lima Greene, curator of contemporary art at the Museum of Fine Arts, recently compared Houston to Paris in the 19th century and New York in the 1940s and 50s. Her bombast seems over the top on the surface, but while considering unrecognizable things it seems only apt to entertain the notion. Her comparison hinged on transplants, expats, making the difference in cultural creativity. She has that right- there are over a hundred languages being spoken in this city, and Houston has absorbed nearly 25% growth in the past decade. Unfortunately for all the potential, the metaphor lacks a cultural capital's presence in popular culture, novels romanticizing the charm and energy, the crime and heartbreak

of an urban area that sets it apart from all the others. You can only watch *Rushmore* and *Reality Bites* so many times, you know. I just hope we have some fucking trains around here soon.

Between repeat viewings of VHS tapes from the 90s, there is a lot to look forward to in 2009. To take your mind off of people being interminable optimists (or pessimists, there are a lot of them) go out and see an art show. Don't just wipe your brow that Houston home prices never bit the big one because they weren't high to begin with, be thankful that the artworld won't suffer 'cause we never had cash on hand anyway. In January, The Center for Land Use Interpretation (sounds like science but it's really not) will lay out their big treatise on

what Texas does at Blaffer Gallery. "Texas Oil: Landscape of an Industry" maps and attempts to explain the big business of black gold from El Paso to the Ship Channel and Baytown. The Art Institute will open a new campus in the spring, Jennifer Ward curates an exhibit of artists and online communities at Fotofest and Mike Jones is coming out with a line of cognac. The Art Guys (they're planning on marrying a tree this summer) and others will open "No Zoning: Houston Artists Engaging the City" in May. We can survive a thousand foreclosures a month, and we can still make art if no one buys it. Hell, I just got laid off by Glasstire.com yesterday, and I'm not stopping for anyone. Damn the bastards. We've got shit to do.

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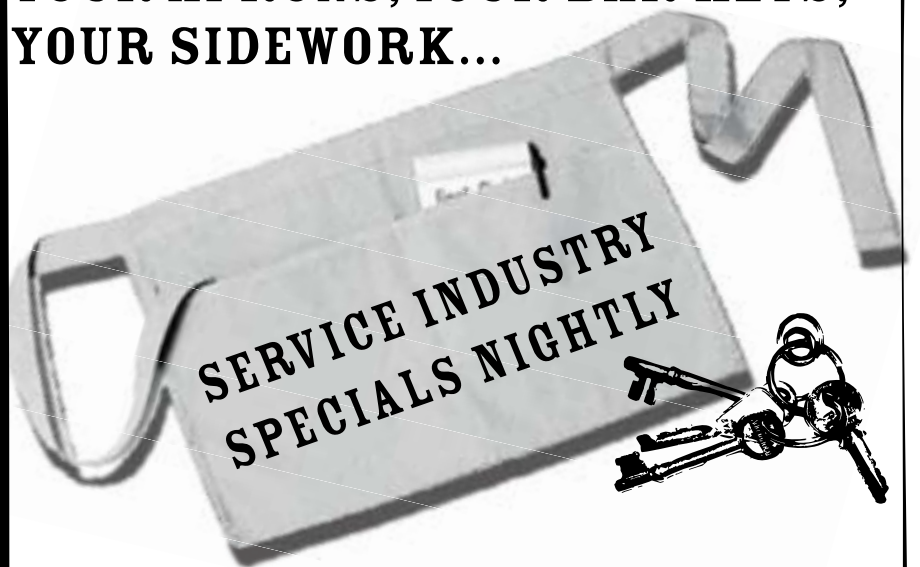
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BEST OF 08 AIN'T AS GOOD AS 07

THE AVERAGE PERSON SEES FIVE TO SEVEN FILMS A YEAR, BUT CHANCES ARE THAT PEOPLE READING THIS ARTICLE ARE ABOVE AVERAGE FILM-GOERS.

FILM MAVENS CAN ALWAYS MUSTER ENTHUSIASM for a year that delivers movies as diverse as Wall-E and The Dark Knight as well as more iconoclastic choices like Steven Soderbergh's four-hour Che, or British director Steve McQueen's amazing feature about imprisoned Irish Republican Army hunger striker Bobby Sands, Hunger. There's even the first-ever animated feature from Israel, Waltz With Bashir.

How odd is it that Tell No One a French film from 2006 grossed right around \$6-million and it's considered the most successful foreign film domestically released in 2008 whereas The Dark Knight has topped \$530-million and is not only the year's most successful film, but the second highest grossing film ever behind Titanic. Obviously there's no relation between quality and the amount of money a film makes.

As good as some of those films are 2008 pales with 2007 a year that saw bona fide classics like There Will Be Blood and No Country For Old Men, not to mention more

esoteric pleasures like The Assassination of Jesse James by the Coward Robert Ford.

That said, my top ten list for 2008 unwinds as follows:

1. Man on Wire
2. Tell No One
3. Slumdog Millionaire
4. Miracle at St. Anna
5. Ghost Town
6. Revolutionary Road
7. The Wrestler
8. The Bank Job
9. Let the Right One In

And at number 10. Waltz With Bashir

If I had a top twenty there'd be a few more foreign titles and a couple more late year platforms and even a Disney cartoon (Bolt not Wall-E), but why complicate things in a weak year? The thing about the films listed one through ten was the sense of not wanting any of them to end. When they did finish was a feeling, although I may return to any of them in the future, of completion and satisfaction at having met a new friend.



🗣 WALTZ WITH BASHIR

Many of the titles have already opened and a couple of them are rolling out in January. Waltz With Bashir (opening January 23 at the Angelika) was such a combination of agitprop and animation that I didn't even know where to start with my admiration. This cartoon docudrama tells the tragedy of the massacre in the Sabra and Shatila camps during the 1982 Lebanon War. The story's told from the point of view of director Ari Folman, who was a teen soldier in the Israeli army at the time. Waltz With Bashir recreates Folman's memories through present day conversations with other soldiers who were also there and surreal scenes that illustrate their memories. The film ends with actual footage shot in the camps (dead children) and you realize that the horror was real.

CADILLAC RECORDS

It must be apparent in this day and age, but growing up I had no idea that Led Zeppelin stole "Whole Lotta Love" from Willie Dixon and that the Beach Boys, ah, appropriated "Sweet Little Sixteen" from Chuck Berry for their hit "Surfin' USA." Both Berry (Mos Def) and Dixon (Cedric the Entertainer) are portrayed in Cadillac Records, the story of Chess Records. With a narrative told in voice-over by Dixon the film weaves an emotional recounting of the record company with Adrien Brody at the center as founder Leonard Chess.

Brody's Chess has his own way of stacking the deck that includes burning down his nightclub for the insurance money to start a recording studio and record label. The behavior of Chess's top artists, like

Muddy Waters (Jeffrey Wright), Howlin' Wolf (Eammon Walker), and Little Walter (Columbus Short) runs the gamut from murder to womanizing and when Etta James (Beyonce Knowles) signs up add drug addiction. Knowles has been taking acting lessons because she's stealing scenes here. Walker demonstrates an amazing ability to channel Wolf's musical genius while Def is a dead ringer for Berry. Wright, as always, demonstrates acting moves that show his versatility. Wright's diction may remind some of Robert Downey Jr. in Tropic Thunder.

Chess takes money from Peter to pay Paul and nobody seems to mind. The topic of artist equality is briefly touched upon but the movie really wants to concentrate on the legacy of music that these brilliant musicians created.

Director Darnell Martin has been working mostly in television since her early feature I Like it Like That in 1994, but Cadillac Records shows her to be the equal if not capable of greater reach than other femme helmers like Kimberly Peirce or Catherine Hardwicke. With its unblinking evocation of the 50s and 60s music scene and a sense of fair play in showing the artists warts and all Cadillac Records is bound to inspire a new generation to discover the blues.

DVD SLIGHT RETURN

If you're planning on hiding in the woods for the winter solstice on December 21, 2012 forget it, you'll still be paying bills come January 2013. That's the consensus of one interviewee from the documentary 2012: Science or Superstition (DVD



street date January 27, 2009). This release from the Disinformation Company also contains extras that take the viewer on a tour of the Mayan pyramid at Palenque as well as expound on the theories of Terence McKenna regarding fractal mathematics and mystical mind expansion. As another talking head explains there's a difference between opening the doors of perception and walking through said doors.

I found 2012: Science or Superstition fascinating on multiple levels. The concepts of Mithraism and the Vedic periapsis sent me scrambling to Wikipedia. The Mayan long count calendar that ends in 2012 merely predicts periods of time that are repeated like peaks and valleys throughout the ages. The shifting of the Earth's magnetic poles may occur over hundreds of years. The CMEs (coronal mass ejections) of our Sun could fry satellites. The Hopi Indians believe that the changes mark the progression from what they term the Fourth World into the Fifth World. The path of the moon, Earth and Sun are lining up at the center of the Milky Way in 2012.

All of these ideas are tossed at the viewer like fastballs in a pennant game. It's not important to accept each theory as fact so much as the information gleamed grounds you in a mindset that accepts our tiny place in a greater universe of change.

Meanwhile Sony Pictures is shooting 2012 with Roland Emmerich directing (set for release July of this year) while Warner Brothers is developing a Whitley Strieber novel on the phenomenon called 2012: The War for Souls.

2012: Science or Superstition won't sway you one way or another. Rather this doc reveals facets for further sturdy from some of the more legitimate sources on the subject. There's so much information coming at you, from the participatory cosmology of the Mayans to Islamic astrology and the doctrine of lunar modes, that you'll have to watch more than once, if only for your own peace of mind.

From Paramount's Centennial Collection a 2 DVD set of Sunset Boulevard covers every bit of minutia surrounding what is hands down one of the best films ever made and certainly the sharpest skewering of Hollywood in a film. The fact the film was directed by Billy Wilder in 1950 only attests to its longevity and classic status.

It's a win-win situation whether you've seen it or not. If you haven't you're guaranteed an evening's worth of solid entertainment. A down on his luck young writer Joe Gillis (Bill Holden) moves in with an aging starlet Norma Desmond (Gloria Swanson) to help her finish her rediscovery script. "I'm big, it's the pictures that got small," Desmond laments.

If you've seen Sunset Boulevard there's a second DVD that has a short or documentary on every possible aspect of the film. The best for buff are outtakes of the original opening, which was cut after a disastrous preview. These clips (m.o.s.) show a corpse being wheeled into a morgue and the dead bodies having a conversation about what how they all got killed.

ANTONY and the JOHNSONS The Crying Light (Secretly Canadian)

I thought this was coming out last year. Needless to say, I’ll take it when it’s ready to be taken. Antony is one of the few artists whose albums are moments because his older songs hold so much weight. I listen to a lot of Nina Simone. I’m not saying this sounds like Nina Simone but I’m saying it resonates like Nina Simone. It’s an artist who is constantly taking chances with the song. But these ARE songs. They’re not hooks, or parts, rather whole songs. Brilliance from the launch to conclusion. It’s not as much waiting for an album, as it is a new composition and another addition to a magnificent catalog. *Another World* is a song that is complimentary and familiar to the artist. It fits what has

been done and what is to be done. This will be one the first moments of the New Year to me. Have you seen the cover?

BLACKOUT BEACH Skin Of Evil (Soft Abuse)

Carey Mercer is a storyteller. Inside of one of his songs lie a town and townsfolk, rumors, suspicion, doubt, fear, and death. Sometimes it’s as if he doesn’t sing but he howls, and he growls. He conveys the emotion, the belief, the disbelief, the faith and the delusion. On the first track on *Blackout Beach*, the lyrics, as haunting as they might have been, were decorated with a soundtrack that evoked the despair and the mystery of the world depicted in the lyrics. The songs were short, but the effect was sustained. *Skin Of Evil* is said to be a concept album, which I guess, is more in the terms of a running narrative. As the atmosphere seems nearly as important as the lyrics themselves, the first glimpse, *Cloud Of Evil*, is bare in arrangement but the sounds flow through like wind. Phrases appear and dissolve. And so it begins...

ANIMAL COLLECTIVE Merriweather Post Pavilion (Domino)

Animal Collective have some how managed to get weirder and more popular. Their shows consist of the band members standing behind a board, almost like DJs, mixing and fading sounds, with an occasional bit of guitar. To an extent, since their classic *Sung Tongs*, they can seem to do no wrong in the eyes of the rock press. Throughout all of this they’ve crafted a more melodic sound while still bearing hints that they could go left at any second. Now they are as much Bjork as they are the Beach Boys. It’s hard to even say if the word ‘rock’ even applies their current incarnation. Still, *Water Curses* was probably one of the

best things put out last year and it was an EP. *Strawberry Jam* was a poppy affair but what the hell was “# 1?” There’s no telling what Animal Collective sound the band will do but whether you-likey or too-psyche, I’m sure this album will be incredible.

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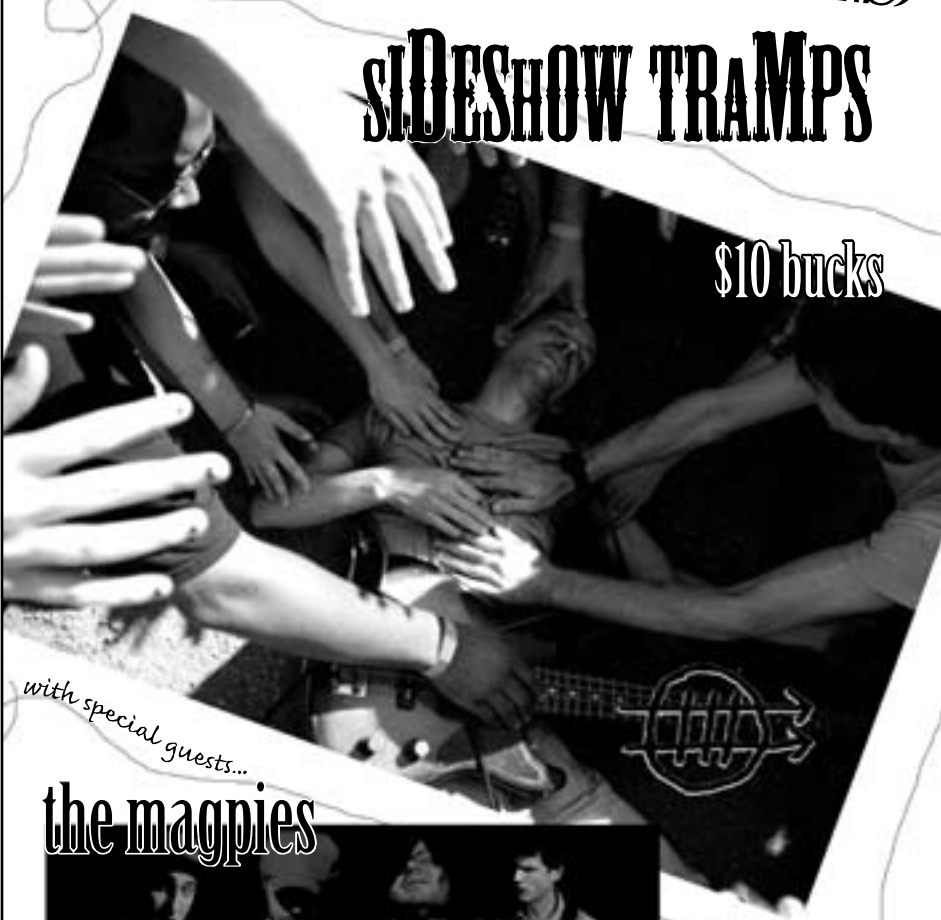

SOMETHING FIERCE HAS BEEN ONE OF HOUSTON’S MOST PRIZED EXPORTS WITH THEIR MIX OF PUNK ENERGY, CATCHY MELODIES, AND AN UNDYING DIY ETHOS. THEIR NEWEST ALBUM - “THERE ARE NO ANSWERS” - EASILY SURPASSES THEIR DEBUT ALBUM WITH SONGS SO SHARPLY WRITTEN THAT THEY WILL RUN YOU THROUGH LIKE A KATANA WITH TOSHIRO MIFUNE AT THE OTHER END.

WE LOVED THE NEW ALBUM so much that we immediately poked and prodded Niki Seven and Steven Garcia with questions as they prepared for their upcoming tour and here is what they had to say:

ON THE NEW ALBUM VS. THE FIRST ALBUM

SG: We’ve definitely fine-tuned our love for powerpop over the last few years. I know that I’ve gravitated to writing razor-sharp pop songs, while maintaining an even darker tone in the lyrics. We took more time [on the new album] and that gave us a lot of opportunities to think about real production for the songs.

N.7: I’ve definitely enjoyed the freedom that we’ve had with this album. ‘Bastards’ was recorded in two days from start to finish; ‘There Are No Answers’ has been a long two-year road in writing and months of recording. We’ve had more time to explore with the songs and figure out what sounded right. Most of the songs on this album don’t sound anything like they did when they were originally written.

ON WRITING SONGS AND TRACKING ALBUMS

SG: I start writing a song with a feeling in mind. I pound away for hours at a time on my own or through various band prac-

tices. We can feel the song “working” or sense it slowly dying. It’s a real disappointment when a song dies out because I feel like I missed an opportunity to seize what was there. When the song does work, we pour our hearts into thinking about what the final version will sound like.

N.7: We’ve all developed an instinct we can tell right away which direction [a song is] going to go.. whether it’s going to be great, whether it needs work, or if it just needs to be put out of its misery as quick and painless as possible. “Modern Girl” has been recorded at least three times. I would have been disappointed releasing one of the previous versions, but this version I think has captured the very best this song has.

SG: There has to be real thought injected into your recordings because those are what will live on beyond the band. Making a good album is very much like making a mix tape. The track listing matters to me, and I had this one song that I could not fit anywhere. The pacing was so different; the beginning and end too abrupt. Finally, we made the decision to cut it from the album, and I think it was a good choice.

ON SINGLES

SG: We got the idea [of including songs from singles] from looking at punk bands

like The Buzzcocks, It’s a fantastic way to keep the songwriter away from writing an “album” and instead just focusing on each individual song.

N.7: The Buzzcocks are my absolute favorite band. ‘Singles Going Steady’ is an amazing record and the notion of creating an album out of singles released for years and years is incredibly genius. For us, I think it just keeps us thinking about the present. It keeps us focused on writing new songs and not re-hashing old ones time and time again. It’s also a great way to keep people interested in a band. It looks like you’re doing more if you keep releasing all these singles than if you just do an album every two or three years.

ON LESSONS LEARNED

SG: I’ve learned how to design lots of artwork, master for vinyl, play bar chords, fold a map, order at Hot Doug’s, record with two amps at the same time, book national tours, clean a bird off of a windshield, clean beer off of my guitar, share a van with five other people, wear a tuxedo for my brother’s wedding, maintain sanity on a 16-hour drive, find ways to get a free motel room, wear

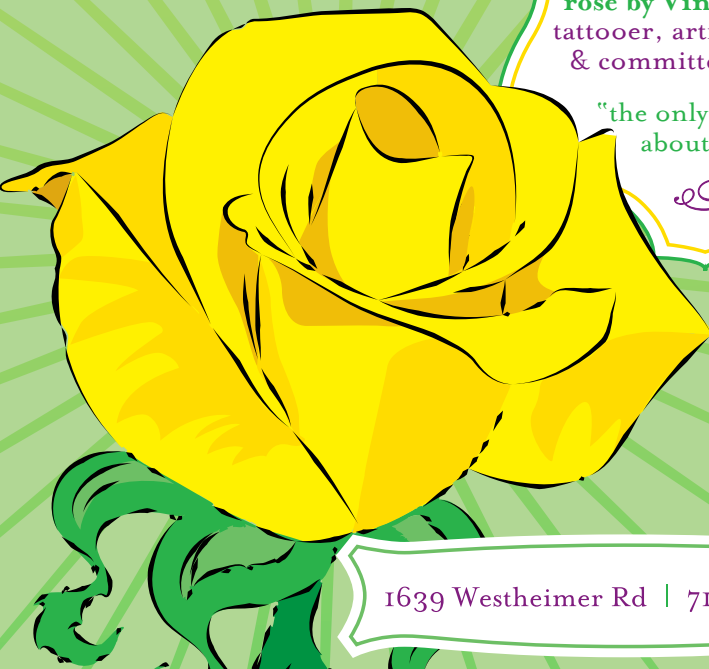

Moral of the story: don’t go to Pasadena. Ever.

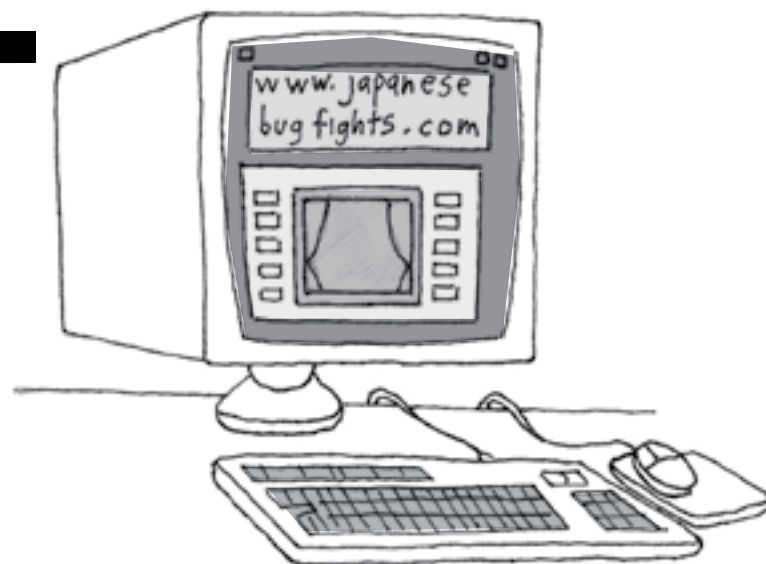

Worst Contractor TIMBERWOOD CARPENTRY

Hurricane Ike is estimated to have done more than 25 Billions Dollars of damage to property along the Texas Gulf Coast. Timberwood Carpentry (10422 Telephone Rd) contracted workers from as far away as Florida and the Carolinas, as well as Louisiana and Texas to work in Port Arthur, Galveston and Houston to do clean up work. Workers were promised transportation, lodging, food, and jobs. Timber wood carpentry provided no safety equipment for the workers cleaning buildings and provided no care

to the their health needs which included skin infections, eye infections, and kidney infections acquired while working in contaminated buildings. They also refused to pay workers the wages owed for the labor provided to around a thousand workers. While protest by workers and supporters, like the Houston Interfaith Worker Justice Center, got many of these problems partially resolved, it reminds you we have bunch or crappy thieving neighbors.

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Climbing Poetree

by Stefan: HIMC covered the stop of climbing poetree's (<http://www.climbingpoetree.com/live/>) hurricane season tour (<http://www.hurricaneseasonontour.com/live/>) in Houston. I found it was a revealing report in two means. On the one hand the contents were awesome, but on the other it reflected the importance of HIMC as an independent source of information. The tour's very beginning evolved within the discrepancy between the reporting mode of the mainstream media about hurricane Katrina and real life stories. That triggered the two women activism of climbing poetree. An apparently natural disaster turned out to be a human made and unnatural disaster. Art became both an organizing tool and a political weapon.

The collective multimedia approach of climbing poetree merges news photos, interviews, music and poetry in order to start radical change in the audience's heads. Straight from the beginning the recipients are respected as actors, their individual journeys are involved by bringing water to the stage when entering the show. The collectively gathered water remains an echoing part of the show. Water evolves as the crucial symbol in the show. It is cascading by being deconstructed and reconstructed. The metamorphosis of the water metaphor is used to enforce change for good.

Further elements of the show are called Stitches and Solution Cycle. The later is like a networking platform for local activists within the show. Sorry to say it didn't happen in Houston. Stitches are a thoughtful translation of the water metaphor into action. Ideas and best practices within the audience are collected on pieces of fabric in the intermission of the show. Afterwards they are stitched together and displayed in front of the next stop's location, mysteriously moved by the wind.

The project Stitches parallels the Idea of Indymedia's open publishing and audience involvement on an artistic level: Don't hate the media, be the media. Listen to an excerpt of the show at houston.indymedia.org/news/2008/11/65693.php - and get involved!

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Grassroots Media Tour

yy Courtney: The Grassroots Media Tour and Convergence was held in Houston TX on Oct 19th 2008 with the goals to first, to focus on states in the South that do not get much media coverage and representation and second, to encourage all of us to not rely on corporate media groups to hear or see the things we want from the media. We can all create our own media.

The day started out with a workshop for local independent media groups. A media group map was created for the public to see who does what media in the community and the type of media they do, as well as what areas of media need more involvement.

The night opened with a short education by Rob for everyone present on how to use the Indy Media site. The first presenter, Brian from T.E.J.A.S showed how, with a laminated card from Pacifica Radio he was able to get onto Galveston Island after hurricane Ike when the residents were still restricted. Brian stressed that, "Calling ourselves media gives us powers."

Next was Hadassah Hill of Spread magazine, she talked about how "Spitzer-gate" brought intense focus on sex workers. Suddenly Fox and CNN were calling their magazine looking to talk to a high priced call girl. A "Sex Workers 101" reference page taking a first step towards teaching the mainstream media how to speak with respect about the people who make their living in the industry.

Jordan Flaherty of Left Turn magazine showed some of the power in You Tube, by screening videos by 2cent Productions out of New Orleans. One video by 2cent productions showed a social action group made to raise awareness to the fact that tourist who pay money to see the destruction in New Orleans are looking at real peoples lives. Another video was made by a group of roommates in an apartment under siege in Beirut called "From Beirut... to those who love us". It was written with a tragic but tough awareness that "the world is watching" the bombing by Israel.

DJ Zin of SOS Radio, which airs on the Pacifica network (Wednesdays 3-5 on 90.1) pointed to the real key: PROMOTION. If we're just reading each other's magazines and they aren't getting distributed, it doesn't move our movements.

Jesse Mohammad of Final Call talked about the ground-level organizing around the Jena 6 that began long before any major public figure was involved. The grassroots organization around made it too big of a story to ignore. He went on to describe a recent and terrible incident, the dragging death of Brandon McClelland in Paris, TX. Again, the early coverage by grassroots movements forced the mainstream media to cover a story they thought they could sweep under the rug by focusing solely on hurricane Ike. He cautioned, "This is nothing to play with. Information is warfare, don't let success go to your head and don't fear failure."



SWU- Summary of Coverage

by John: As 2008 comes to an end, HIMC covered a number of stories that were timely, unique, and crucial for getting the news out, when no one else was covering particular stories. For me, one of the best stories we featured was the coverage of the 20th anniversary celebration of the Southwest Workers Union, in San Antonio, Texas, the weekend of the 5th and 6th of December. The Southwest Workers Union (SWU) is a membership, community based, independent union, representing public school workers, from a number of school districts in the San Antonio area. With 3000 members, the SWU has been in the forefront of grassroots struggles, not only in San Antonio, but nationally. Folks from the SWU organized the first ever border forum in 2007, that was held in Ciudad Juarez. The SWU was also very much involved in the organizing and planning of the recent US Social Forum. In all the work that SWU undertakes, it is consistently, raising the issue of globalization and unity with other grassroots organizations. At the 20th anniversary celebration, representatives from grassroots organizations across the country, as well as from Puerto Rico and Mexico, were on hand, to express solidarity and congratulations for 20 years of grassroots struggle.

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MUNTADAR AL-ZAIDI DID

What We Journalists Should Have Done Long Ago

WHEN IRAQI JOURNALIST MUNTADAR AL-ZAIDI HEAVED HIS TWO SHOES AT THE HEAD OF PRESIDENT GEORGE W. BUSH DURING A PRESS CONFERENCE IN BAGHDAD, HE DID SOMETHING THAT THE WHITE HOUSE PRESS CORPS SHOULD HAVE DONE YEARS AGO.

AL-ZAIDI LISTENED TO BUSH BLATHER that the half-decade of war he had initiated with the illegal invasion of Iraq had been “necessary for US security, Iraqi stability (sic) and world peace” and something just snapped. The television correspondent, who had been kidnapped and held for a while last year by Shiite militants, pulled off a shoe and threw it at Bush—a serious insult in Iraqi culture—and shouted “This is a farewell kiss, you dog!” When the first shoe missed its target, he grabbed a second shoe and heaved it too, causing the president to duck a second time as al-Zaidi shouted, “This is from the widows, the orphans, and those who were killed in Iraq!”

I’ll admit, listening to Bush lie his way through eight years of press conferences, while pre-selected reporters played along and pretended to get his attention so they could ask questions which had been submitted and vetted in advance, I have felt like throwing my shoes at the television set.

Al-Zaidi, who paid for his courageous act of protest by being brutally beaten by security guards, is a hero of the profession. He stopped taking the president’s BS and called him what he is: a murderer and a criminal, with the blood of perhaps upwards

of a million Iraqis on his hands. Al-Zaidi used what was supposed to be a staged photo-op for the president as an opportunity to speak up for those whose lives have been ruined by this president—the ones our suck-up journalists routinely ignore.

I’m not suggesting that journalists should routinely leave presidential press conferences in their stocking feet. We have different ways of expressing our sentiments to people we feel have insulted our intelligence than throwing shoes at them, but it would be nice to see a journalist or two flip the president the bird when he lies so blatantly to them. Or they could all get up and just walk out, leaving him standing alone at the presidential lectern.

It’s time for the press corps to stop treating presidents like royalty. If he accomplished anything at all in eight years in office, President Bush has demonstrated that, to the contrary, the president is a very ordinary—and in his case a rather less than ordinary—man. The office of president deserves no more respect than that of the mayor of Detroit, or of Wasilla.

My suggestion is that the press corps use the remaining five weeks of the Bush administration to develop a new relationship with the presidency—one in which they drop all the phony propriety and tradition and start acting like boisterous newshounds of old, barking questions, laughing cruelly at inane answers, demanding follow-ups when they are given the run-around, and, where

necessary, walking out, or perhaps tossing the occasional shoe.

The journalism profession was a full-blown disaster and an utter disgrace during the Bush administration, and with all the crises facing the country and the world, in part because of that failure on their part, we cannot afford to have them continue that failure into the Obama administration.

With the Bush administration reduced to a running joke at this point, it gives the journalism profession a chance to redeem itself by using these few remaining weeks to establish a new tradition for presidential press conferences and photo-ops—one that can continue on into the new presidency.

Meanwhile, I’m suggesting that my alma mater, the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism, hire al-Zaidi to teach a class in press conference journalism techniques. They should make it a multi-year appointment, because if he left after just one year, his would be difficult shoes to fill.
