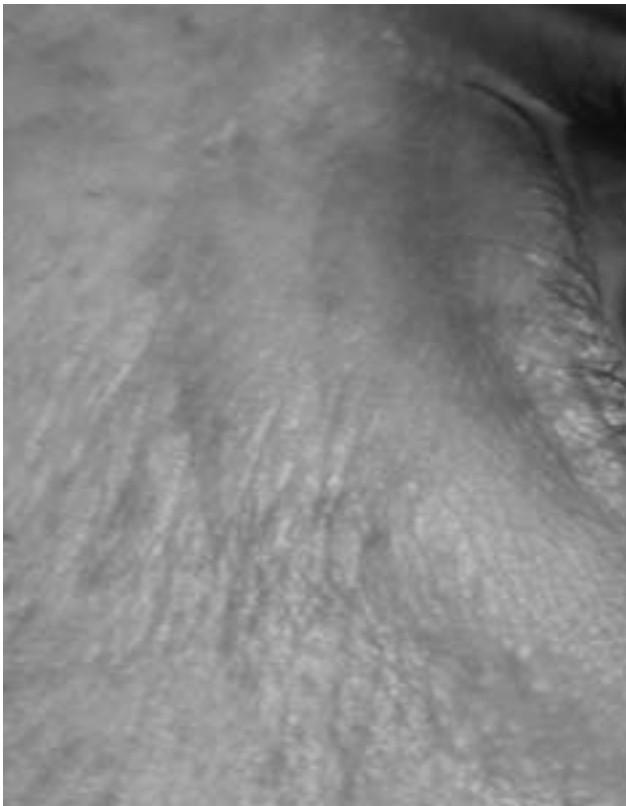

HAVEN'T HEARD OF IT? Seen the billboards of bauxite pterodactyls? Or their web ads with a shiny tin cowboy boot? Hmm.... then you must not be one of the five hundred artists who submitted to the exhibit. Pardon me while I tell those artists **FUCK YOU YOU GOT HOSED**. Excuse me, but I had a feeling one of them might read this and I couldn't resist the urge to publicly insult someone. If you are sitting next to someone who entered the show tell 'em for me. Their ridiculousness is only eclipsed by the willingness of advertisers to use, exploit and degrade you. Three things strike me as particularly stupid in this endeavor, an artist's willingness to forgo one's judgment of

materials, the inestimable monetary cost of the project and the complacency and triviality of the artworld. Materials, malleable objects and ideas, are explored through trial and error and practice. Conceptual artists screaming in a dark room go through the same shtick as a watercolor artist painting on a Sunday afternoon. Exploring materials, finding what you like to work with is a big part of artistic identity. Warhol had silk-screens, Rauschenberg had ink transfers and Oldenburg had cloth. Robyn O'Neil has pencils, Bert Long has ice and the Art Guys have their bodies. Why would you limit yourself to a prescribed, corporate material? Barring an intensely enlightened group working



together for a very long time I would not believe an exhibit of one material could *ever* be justifiable. The fact that the show looked like a high school hallway on parent's night was unavoidable, but shame on you guys for getting duped into thinking this could ever be worth it beyond that navel-gazing moment of delight that comes with being included. On the team. By the way, in getting on this team, how much did you guys spend on those cans you've woven into dragons, moustaches and the Statue of Liberty? Didn't think about it did ya. Or maybe it just blew by; you were so high on fructose syrup and guarana. No entry fee for the exhibit? What a crock of bullshit. It'd cost you \$200 to construct a spaceman out of your product's encasement. Maybe it only cost a hundred bucks to cover that guitar in \$4 eight-ounce cans. It's kind of like usury. Does it seem stupid to enter yet? Or would you like to hear about Arthur Vaisvilas' piece? I am terribly surprised at the ability to bend over backwards and lower their standards that many jurors demonstrated, as well as the media outlets and even well meaning artists. Oh, I mean that I'm so surprised that they can do that when there is money involved. Did that slip my mind? Woops. As one juror stiffly said; "don't take it so seriously, they're not artists." I was staggered. I kind of hoped that they were artists. I kind of believe that they are, even Arthur, and they shouldn't have to go away when the money leaves. The kvetching that went on when the Hunting Prize patronized to artists sent the community into an uproar, but no one takes this seriously? Damned bull, I would have preferred a pinewood derby or an air show, and this will not do. At least it has proven that corporations have an extensive reach in the artworld, and to resist it is futile. I'm not drinking a can of that shit. I'll drink the Kool-Aid.

THIN WIRE LINE

The edge of my seat was the last place I expected to be. Some movies can produce vertigo by tricking the eyes. For instance, a special Imax process called Omnivision (literally a one-of-a-kind screen that stretches both in front of your eyes and over your head, located in Las Vegas) where your entire peripheral vision is engaged.

THE OMNIVISION FILM UNSPROCKETED WITH A HAWAIIAN THEME and the first image hurled you into the azure Pacific Ocean at rocket speeds. The first reaction is to roll up into a ball and duck under your seat.

But this was a documentary on the small screen no less. Yet the effect of watching the Man on Wire trailer on YouTube can leave you dizzy. In the theater the very act of watching high wire hi-jinx being performed with no fear of death coupled with shots establishing the depth of the fall will produce armrest-hugging fear in even the most fleetfooted viewer.

Man on Wire documents what has to be the ultimate performance art crime of all time. Artist and acrobat Philippe Petit schemed and planned and surreptitiously assembled an international crew, snuck into both towers of the World Trade Center at the appropriate time, strung cable throughout the night and at daybreak walked across the span about eight times over a period of forty minutes. All this went down on August 7, 1974 although Petit had planned the walk for several years. Petit flew to New York a few times during his planning and as he tells the story in director James Marsh's Man on Wire he was planning it like a noir crime caper.

Marsh unfolds the events like a mystery. Every 20-minutes or so there's a new character introduced or a new development in Petit's strategy. To string the wire an initial guideline is shot tower to tower via bow and arrow. How Petit finds the arrow in the dark, and how Marsh recreates this particular recollection, clearly demonstrates how weird the whole expedition had become.

When the police finally show up, Petit stops just out of reach of the cop and walks back out into the middle of the wire. This is where you engage the theater chair drink holder located near your right knee as a foothold.

We see the participants, as they were through photos and some filmed footage, and in the present day much wiser and over 30-years older. Colorful 1970s industrial shots of the Twin Towers puts their grandeur

in perspective even showing the progress of construction. On one trip Petit got to the roof and is seen in photos joking with a crew up there.

After taking precise measurements Petit recreated the set up in a field back in France, and practiced the 200-foot walk, even if it was five feet off the ground. When the climatic moment comes we have a combination of recreation, actual photos and briefly a moment of film shot from a news helicopter spiraling above Petit, a man without trepidation.

The title comes from the police description of the crime in progress. The cop had written on the crime report "man on wire." Part of the fascination rests in Petit's mischievous manner, an almost uncanny resemblance to the antics of silent film stars like Harold Lloyd or Buster Keaton, both who performed many of their own stunts. Man on Wire includes snippets of other equally death defying walks that Petit performed before being arrested at Notre Dame and the Brooklyn Bridge. Petit even contributed illustrations to the new Debra Winger book she was signing at the MFAH last month. Somebody put Petit in a movie with Jackie Chan immediately.

Man on Wire opens in Houston on August 15.

Swing Vote delivers chad

There's a blunt edge to its political humor that's tempered with a young girl single Dad dynamic so common in Disney films that permeates Swing Vote. In a storyline out of a Capra film, right down to the sacks of mail in the finale, one person holds the destiny to an upcoming Presidential election because of their uncounted election stub.

In fact the movie could be more about a single parent raising a precocious child than the current political fracas. "And Bull Durham wasn't about baseball and Tin Cup wasn't about golf," Kevin Costner tells Free Press Houston during a round table interview. Costner and Madeline Carroll, who play Bud and Molly Johnson in Swing Vote, swung through town last month to stump for the film.

In a slightly outlandish turn of events Bud has gotten laid off work by what he calls "insourcing," Mexican immigrants brought in replace him at the egg factory. It didn't

help when security cameras caught Bud sneaking a beer behind a huge stack of egg crates and then knocking them all over. Bud also plays in a Willie Nelson tribute band called Half Nelson, only a couple of members are still incarcerated. Bud cusses a lot. "Bud's not a PTA Dad, he's not a soccer Dad," Costner intones.

"I'm glad they gave it a PG-13 because I wasn't going to cut one goddam out of it," Costner continued. You can get a lot of goddams and quite a few scatological euphemisms into a PG-13 flick, but you usually only get one or two F-bombs. "I wasn't going to cut 'Fuck, thank you Jesus.' There's a saving grace about Bud, that's the strength of the movie," Costner declared.

In an effort to court Bud's one and deciding vote the Republican incumbent President Boone (Kelsey Grammer) and his wry advisor (Stanley Tucci) determine that Bud, an everyman if there ever was one, leans to the left. The Republicans adopt a friendly gay marriage stance with Boone's next campaign spot. Meanwhile the Democratic challenger Donald Greenleaf (Dennis Hopper, Costner's nemesis in

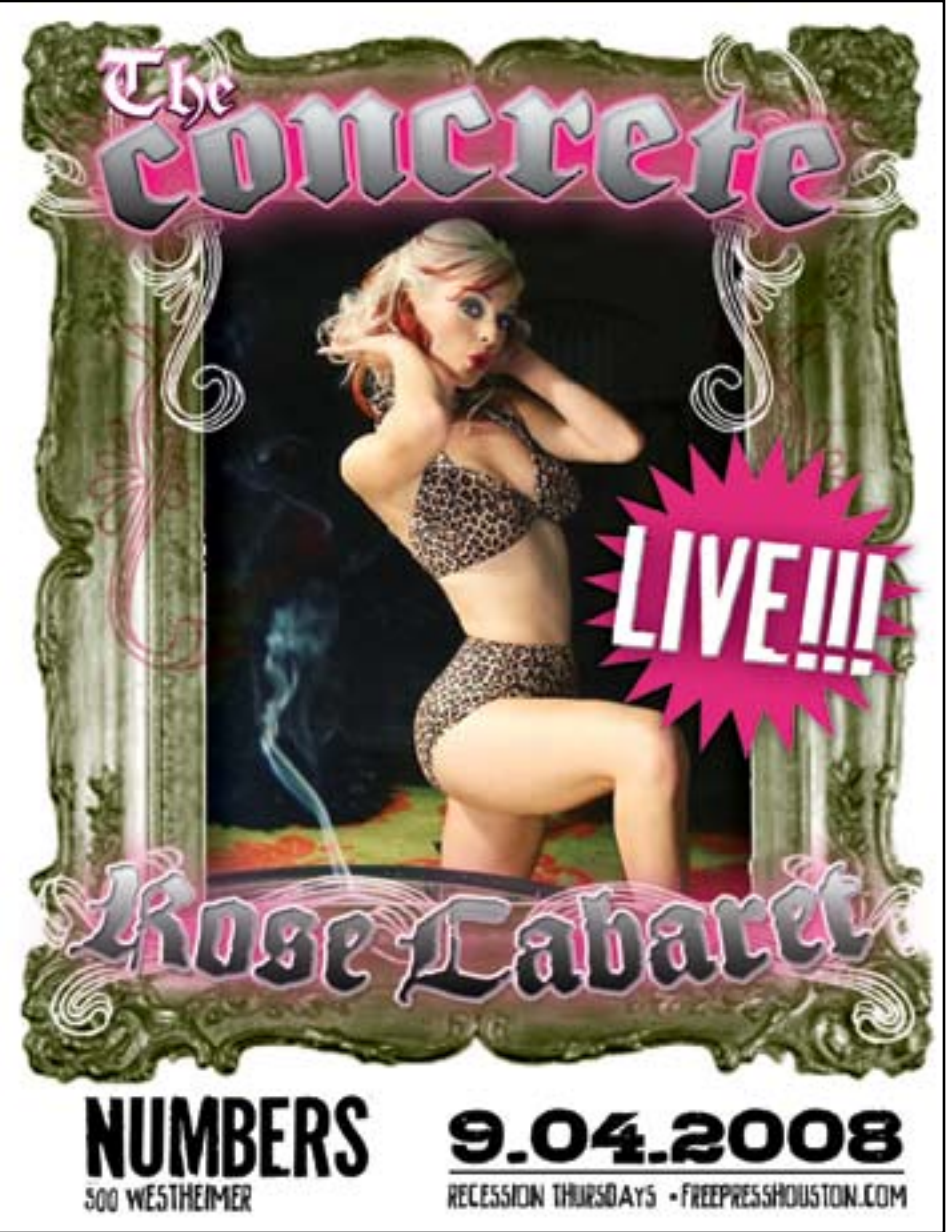
Waterworld) takes an anti-abortion position and decries an unguarded border situation because his manager (Nathan Lane) thinks Bud fields to the right.

One spoof commercial has Hopper walking in a schoolyard of children who subsequently each disappear in a puff of smoke: "Join me and the Democrats as we preserve all life, thus fulfilling God's intelligent design," Greenleaf states.

Asked whether anyone on the production saw parallels with the current Obama/McCain race Costner reminded the film was shot a year ago. "Nobody was calculating in the first place. If this movie could only work in election year then it'd be a failure. It has to work five years from now. For me it had the kind of emotional bottom I like."

The third installment in the Mummy franchise, The Mummy: Tomb of the Dragon Emperor, opens against Swing Vote. Costner doesn't play the game of guessing opening weekend grosses. "I'd like to kick Mummy's ass but we don't stand a chance," he laughs. "That doesn't mean we're a bad movie."

If you happen to be a fan boy (or girl) of the indie music scene and manage to get out and about every once in awhile, you have probably encountered a conversation or twelve about the music scene – or lack thereof- in Houston.

I can’t count the number of times I’ve been at a show or on the patio at Rudyard’s and either started or got sucked into an intense – sometimes tipsy – discussion about why my favorite bands hate Houston and are once again skipping over our beloved town in lieu of playing in Austin or *gasp* Dallas.

Another aspect of this beating-a-dead-horse debate also centers on the issue of local music. More specifically, the debate sometimes involves some variation on the question of whether Houston has the kind of local music scene that rivals other large cities. Anyone who faithfully reads our humble little paper probably already knows the answer to this question. But, for the rest of you slackers, I am going to give you the lowdown on some of the best local talent Houston has to offer.

When I was a teenager, so many years ago, there were a handful of local bands I adored (e.g. Bee Stung Lips, The Last Wish, Clouded). Sadly, these bands have long

since parted, but the memories of hanging out at places like Urban Art Bar and Zelda’s, ogling my favorite local band of the month, still remain. And though most of the places I frequented as a kid are gone, my appreciation for local bands has only grown deeper over the years. Despite what some might believe, Houston’s local music scene is thriving...you just need to get off your ass and see for yourself.

The month starts strong with the much anticipated CD release for **Sharks & Sailors**. These guys (and girl) have been playing music in this town for a lot of years. Their first EP was released back in 2006 and we (and by we, I mean I) have been waiting with baited breath for a new recording. Their sound has changed a bit over time. The songs are still heavy and intense, but there is now a sort of ambient softness to some of the tunes that makes the music all that much more interesting to hear. Sharks & Sailors will be pimping out their new record over at Walter’s on August 1. **The Jonx** and **Ume** will also be performing.

One really great and inexpensive way to check out some of the local bands that you haven’t seen is by checking out either the Secret Saturday Shows over at Shady Tavern in the Heights or Recession Thursdays over at Numbers. The SSS shows are every Saturday no matter what the weather and are...free! Yes, you read that correctly, free. Shows take place from 2 to 5 pm and will feature three to four local acts. This is the ideal way to get out and support the local scene, hang out with some cool people and see some darn good music. August 2-3 will be the SSS Festival featuring some of Houston’s finest like **The Tontons**, **Basses Loaded**, **The Monocles**, **Hearts of Animals**, **The Wiggins**, and **Giant Princess**. The festival will start at noon on both Saturday and Sunday and will collectively feature over 30 local acts. The cost is minimal with a small cover charge of \$3 for one day or \$5 bucks for the weekend. This is an all ages show, so bring the family out and take advantage of this unique event.

August must be *the* month for record releases because there are a handful of local albums set to come out. **Balaclavas** crept quietly onto the scene just a couple of years ago and has been creating a post-punk rock sound that is remarkably focused and has become more robust with age. The music grabs a hold of your insides and forces you to pay attention. It might be hard to take in

all at once – but don’t fret – it doesn’t take long for the music to make sense...well, sort of make sense. Just accept every plunk of the guitar and every rumble of the drum for what it is and you’ll be fine. **Balaclavas** is having their LP release on August 7 at Walter’s alongside **The Wiggins** and **Ariel Pink’s Haunted Graffiti**.

If that isn’t enough to wet your local whistle, **Arthur Yoria** will be playing a couple of shows with other local favorites like **Spain Colored Orange** at the Mink on August 1 and at Rudyard’s with **Pale and Glasnost** August 16. Houston rock stars **American Sharks** are sharing the stage with **The Monocles** and DC punk band **The Points** on August 7 at Rudyard’s. There is also the **Leave Your Genre At The Door** event over at Fitzgerald’s on August 1. For just 10 dollars, you get a night’s worth of local flavor with performers such as **Kam**, **Satin Hooks**, **The Tontons**, **Perseph 1 & Andacc** and **The Television Skies**.

In a city as big as Houston it can be hard to feel connected to anything. Supporting local music is an economical and creative way to get to know your city a little better. From booking companies to musicians, there are a lot of people dedicating their time and resources to bring quality music to town. Take a little time and check some of it out – you won’t be sorry you did.

an idiot in a bear suit to make that happen. People these days!

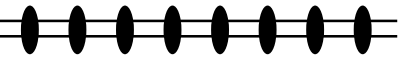
Do either of you have health insurance? Allergic to any medications?

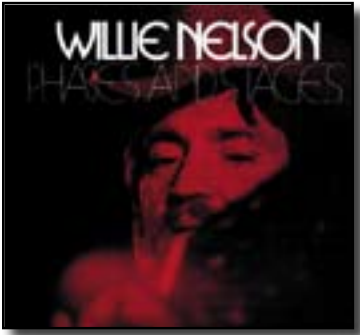

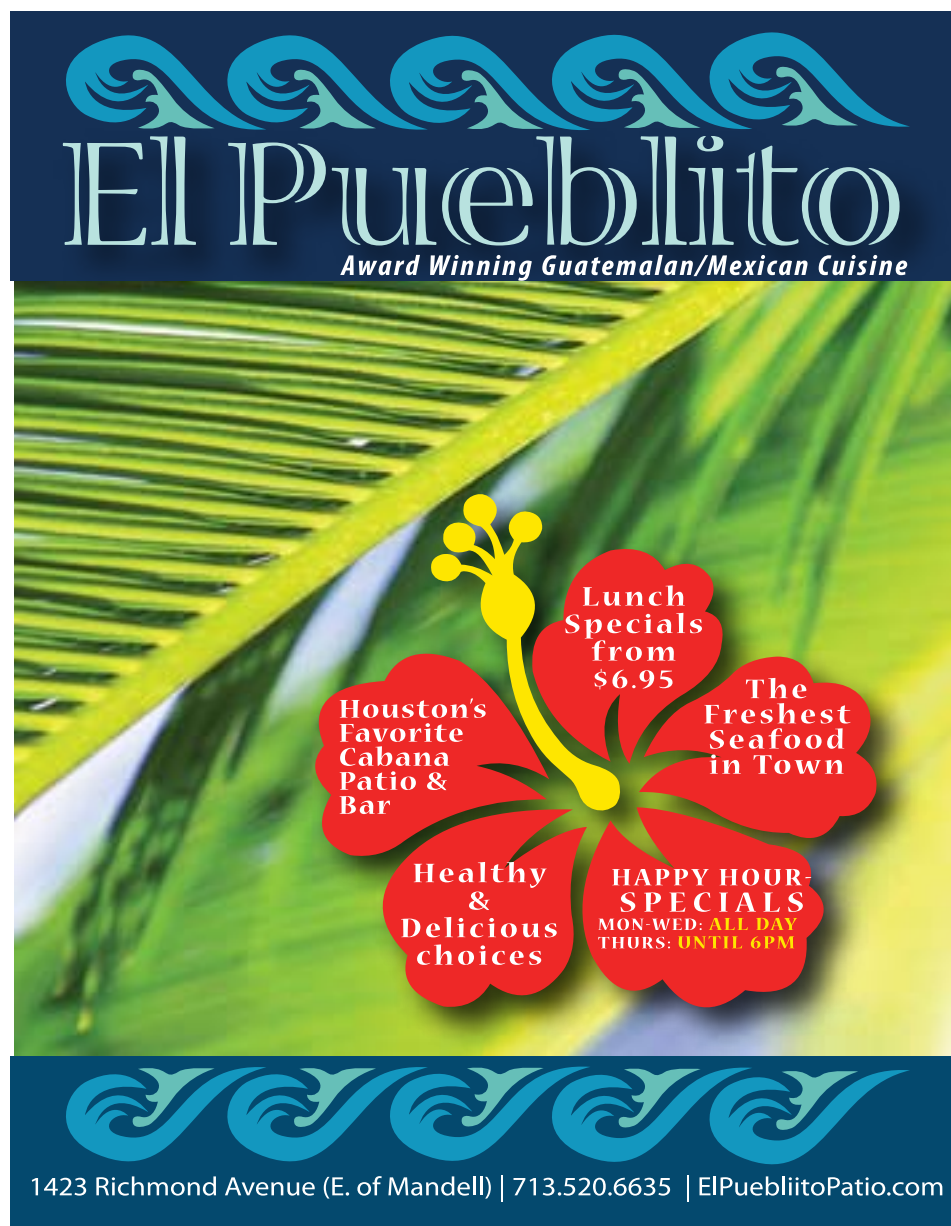

On stage, Mike Rollin releases a soft cascade of notes that shimmer from his guitar. Unexpectedly, the notes segue into a blast of syncopated chords that churn an ugly black bile. Melissa Lonchambon’s bass meets his guitar with a harmonic, perhaps a fraction of a frequency off, and the dissonant oscillations discharge fury into the air like St. Elmo’s Fire demanding everyone’s attention.

Suddenly, at the front of the stage, a tide of metal dudes has rolled in - a sweaty dark clothed wave of men called forth by the riptide of Phil Woodward’s pounding drums and the dissonant amplified strings. Fists are clenched - thrusting the Dio devil sign. The crowd is screaming at the top of their lungs while their veins burst from their necks from the force of their voices. The song being played is instrumental but that doesn’t stop one blonde haired kid from reaching up with an arm dripping in the slick salty humidity of the atmosphere. He grabs the microphone on the stage and emits a guttural growl that would summon Cthulu. The black gang, though smiling, keeps to the task at hand and feeds the boilers through to the end of “Rickshaw” where they are met with wild cheers from over the gunnel of the stage.

Sharks and Sailors may, from this description of a recent show at Rudyard’s, sound like the most metal of metal bands -

the darkest of the dark things to rise from the depths – but that would be misleading. The band is actually one of the most odd and original constructs to arise from Houston’s music scene - combining elements of metal, indie rock, and prog into a sophisticated machine like no other. Beyond the brutal pounding described above, their new album, Builds Brand New, employs smooth melodic pop elements (Thrill), jarring time signatures (Fix Your Radar), and lovely psychedelic shoegaze (Condor).

The band went for a quartet (with Allen Hendrix) to a trio during the making of the new album. When I ask them what differences they experienced, I’m met with a wry “Fewer strings!”

“There is also less volume,” says Phil. “We’ve already proven we can play louder than a 747. With a three-piece there is more space and we pay more attention to the vocals.”

Melissa, whose vocals are one of the wow elements of the album, says, “I’d never sung before, so singing was odd for me par-

ticularly because I’m not a very loud person to begin with but, when I go to a show, I want to hear people belt it out.”

That’s pretty typical of the band that never seems to want to take the easy route. “We push each other hard,” says Mike. “There are tapes of us tossing Fs at each other.”

Melissa explains the dynamic, “What happens is we hit this friction point where 98% of a song is written then we spew venom.”

“That just comes from the excitement and passion of almost having it done,” says Mike. “‘Rickshaw’ was a song I wrote on this shitty Peavy Rage amp. It never had a pretty quality to it. While writing it, Phil and I got into an epic argument and Melissa got it all on video tape.”

As if on cue, Phil burst out a re-enactment, “Fucking help me here!!!!”

“That’s not my responsibility!!” shouts back Mike.

“Just Point!” laughs Phil.

“What the fuck is that pointing thing?!!!” retorts Mike

“Just Fucking Point!” screams Phil.

After some composure is restored, I explain how I’m always surprised that despite their lack of theatrics people always give them their full attention. Mike attributes that partly to how their shows are structured. “It’s a drag when bands play then stop to tune or ask for a beer; all the momentum is lost. I never take the audience for granted or want to waste their time. That’s why we’ll have samples going off between the

songs - to keep it seamless.”

I suggest that odd time signatures are normally a turn-off for non-musicians but Mike counters, “We were just listening to ‘Master of Puppets’ and it’s in 15 but you don’t really notice it because it’s done so well.”

“We make odd grooves but we don’t want to shove it in people’s faces.” explains Phil, “I’ll use a bass drum pattern against a guitar’s odd time signature where my beat smoothes it out. I can geek out on stuff like that but we’re not forcing it - that just comes naturally.”

While Phil elucidates on the matter, I point to two odd music notations on the dry erase board. “What does this mean?” I ask.

“Oh, that? See, there are two kinds of songs,” says Mike.

“Trucker,” explains Phil, “that’s a song that keeps your head bobbin’ - where you’re driving 80 in the middle of downtown with your rig and nothin’ is stopping you! And Alabama? That’s a song where you can substitute the lyrics with the word Alabama!”

Suddenly, the band that I previously described as sophisticated is laughing and shouting “AL-U-BAH-MUH!” at the top of their lungs.

Sid Meirer’s Civilization Revolution reviewed

I’m at E3, at a demo of Borderlands and BioShock, when 2K rep comes over, asking if I want a demo of Sid Meirer’s Civilization Revolution.

“NO THANKS,” I RESPOND. “I have a meeting in 15 minutes, and I don’t want to be late.”

“It only takes 15 minutes,” the rep quipped.

“Thanks, but I gotta get going,” I said, thinking myself: “Yea, like I’m going to miss my hands-on with Fallout 3 to see the absolute train-wreck of Civilization’s PC exodus to home consoles.”

And my pessimistic attitude stood firm, until I got home from E3 where a review copy of CivRev was waiting for me. I felt a little bad for declining the demo at E3, so the first night I got home (even though I had my fill of gaming) I popped the disc into my Xbox 360, and gave it a try. Next thing I know it’s 4 a.m., and I’ve just won my first campaign. CivRev is addictive in the just-one-more-turn kinda way. Each new turn meant I would have another infantry unit to defend my home base, that I’d be one more

turn closer to finishing my Nuclear research. Would a great leader abandon their civilization at a time like this? Hell no.

The turn-based system is the sole reason CivRev works so well on consoles. It plays more like a board game where each side takes its turn (think: Risk, Monopoly) than the PC counterpart which plays without any turns whatsoever. It’s because of this turn-based system too, that every single bit of gameplay that’s in the Xbox 360/PS3 version also makes it in the Nintendo DS version. And with that, developer Firaxis Games has struck gold with a winning translation of a revered PC strategy game to the home and portable consoles.

You won’t find the immense depth of the PC version, but I wouldn’t call CivRev shallow either. There are the 16 civilizations to choose from, and you can still win a campaign through means other than the total annihilation of your enemies. Technological,

financial, and cultural domination are all other paths to victory, but a main complaint I have with the game is that it doesn’t give the player enough cues of how to win with these other ways. And, it’s much easier to just farm out the most military units and win with military might.

When you are engaged in combat, there’s this great one-to-one/dice-roll mechanic. Your troop’s stats will factor into the dice-roll aspect of combat, but there’s also this one-to-one system where the actual animation of your troops deal damage. If your troops move in right away, they’ll gain an advantage on the offensive, but if they back-up, they’ll be handicapped. Likewise, if your troops are on a hill, or defending a home base, they’ll gain defensive bonuses. And even the map and characters interact. If one of your archers gets struck by a warrior unit near a mountain or building, he’ll fly backward and actually bounce off of the structures.

There’s also much less micromanaging. Your villagers collect resources near your home without having to be directed to do so. They’ll automatically balance the type of

resources they collect, but you also have the options to tell certain villages to mine more technology, gold, or food.

Another element that was designed specifically for the console versions is the size of the maps. And while I don’t feel that they need to be bigger, it is a little concerning that you’ll always be surrounded by other civilizations competing for the same resources. And, things get claustrophobic quickly if you don’t make alliances, or dominate a neighboring civilization early. But at the same time, the size of the maps, or lack of, is also a factor that helps speed up the game -- you can complete a campaign in about three hours, whereas some campaigns on the PC can last upwards of eight to ten hours.

Given that real-time-strategy games usually suffer when brought to consoles, CivRev is able to side-step the traps of the PC translation. Other console RTS games suffer from the pacing and controls, the size of the characters and maps, but developer Firaxis Games turns the disadvantages of the hardware into advantages, and paves the way for the console RTS’ revolution.

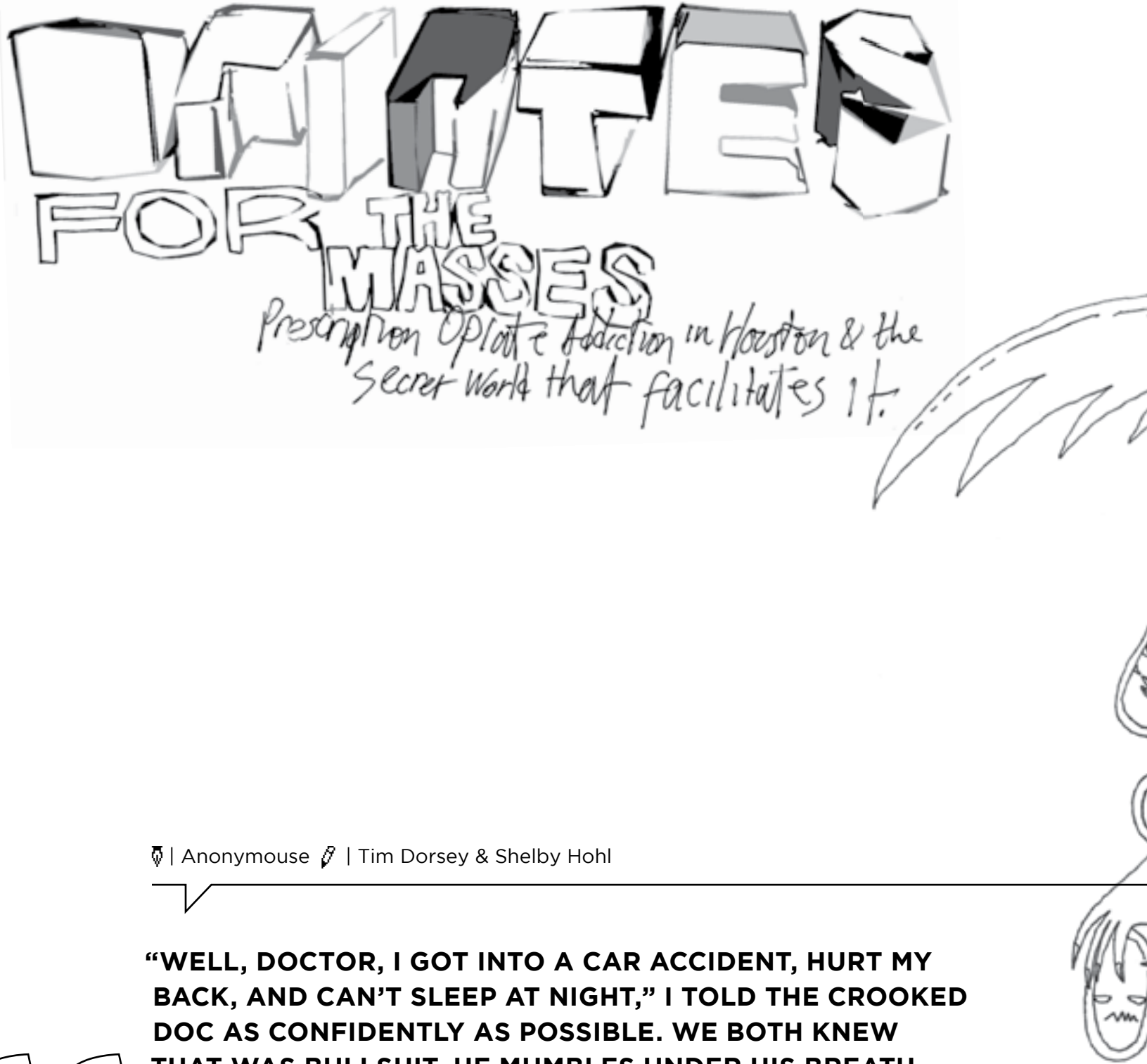

“WELL, DOCTOR, I GOT INTO A CAR ACCIDENT, HURT MY BACK, AND CAN’T SLEEP AT NIGHT,” I TOLD THE CROOKED DOC AS CONFIDENTLY AS POSSIBLE. WE BOTH KNEW THAT WAS BULLSHIT. HE MUMBLES UNDER HIS BREATH AND WRITES ME A PRESCRIPTION, LICKETY-SPLIT.

THAT’S IT?” I ASKED MYSELF. So there I had it: A prescription in hand for 150 Lorcets, 100 Xanax, and 100 Soma. There are dozens of these crooked ‘Pain Management Clinics’ here in Houston and across the nation that conveniently facilitate legions of prescription opiate addictions.

I began experimenting with Vicodin pills in high school. Man, those things made me feel so good. They helped me shove everything else to the side and made me feel like what I was doing was worthwhile. However, back then, they were really hard to come by. That was until I met Brian. He was giving them to me at a cheap price, or so I thought, as I indiscriminately took what I could. It did not seem like anything bad. I mean, it was just a pill. Next thing I know, I am taking ten to twelve a day.

After growing tired of paying street value, I decided to ask Brian how he was getting them so cheap and how I could flip a

few to make some money back. That’s when he introduced me to the glamorous world of Pain Management Clinics. Houston is bursting with these crooked doctors that make great livelihoods on others’ misery. He took me to an innocuous building off of Beltway 8 at West Bellfort. I had no idea what I was getting into. You enter what seems like an ordinary doctor’s office yet it is teeming with armed security. You fill out your entry form as you watch junkies rushing to fill theirs out to get their precious goods. Now, the waiting room is packed full of hungry fiends exchanging information about better deals on their drugs and who they know that can help you out. People are there to get everything from Lean (Codeine cough syrup), Vicodins, Lorcets, Percocets, etc. But in the end, it’s all the same shit. Now, these places are so packed that they call patients into the doctor’s office in groups of ten. To give a veneer of legitimacy, they then scuttle

patients momentarily into individual rooms. Even the nurses are shady. After a 45 second ‘discussion’ with the ‘doctor’, you are raced out of the door with the quickness in which you came in. The visit costs 90 dollars. Funny thing is that there are junkies outside the door propositioning you to buy a few from you. No way. Why would I let you in on my hard earned harvest? Then comes the doozy. The back of the prescription has a list of the shady pharmacies that will fill these out and give you the opiates. These are the kind of pharmacies with burglar bars. See, your standard Walgreens or CVS won’t touch these illicit prescriptions. So you are forced to make your way to ‘mom and pop’ pharmacies that are used to filling these orders as much as they get robbed. After handing over my 140 dollars, they doled me out my precious 300 pills. I remember sitting in my car staring at this huge, beautiful bottle thinking, “ I am set.” I made plans around these



bottles. I had a few weeks of peace of mind. Opiate addicts always feel like their running out though. Nevertheless, the great thing was that I had legit bottles with my name on it. That means if I got pulled over, a cop couldn’t stick me with the felony per pill I was carrying. I returned to this place a handful of times. Unfortunately, at the time, patients were only allowed to enter this place once a month. Bummer.

For at least 18 months, I was steady taking nearly a dozen a day and feeling diminishing returns on the effects. One day, at my retail job in the mall, I ran out of pills and had one of the worst withdrawal episodes of my life. Waking up feeling like death, I got ready for work with cold sweats. I shit my pants on the way to work. Violently feeling the effects of no opiates, I lied down on the floor behind the cash register hoping no customers would enter the store. You see, opiate junkies get body pains, visceral stom-

ach pains from their nerve endings desiring the drug. It’s like having the flu on steroids. I remember lying in bed punching the wall and being angry with God. I soon became tired of this life and found the fortitude to at least try to get off the opiates. I went through several unsuccessful attempts and worked my way back onto the drug. My life at the time was one big plane crash and Vicodin was my parachute. I struggled back and forth like this for months until I had the guts to look inward and see my desperation. I was no longer myself. I was enslaved to getting these pills. After many physical struggles, lots of soul searching and a few spiritual LSD trips, I have managed to stay away from the addiction for some time now. However, if you met the old me and you had a few ‘beans’ in your pocket right now, I would start to sweat. I would be oblivious to anything else. I just might think about breaking your neck and hiding you behind a building.

I was practicing my short game in Omar’s front yard when he walked out to complain about the noise. Tim was drawing pictures and keeping bar from his lawn chair situated next to the record player but safely behind the tee box. We ran around the yard like children until the song ended; then jumped in the car and headed to Rudyard’s to brief over beer and burgers. Omar was familiar with this crazy bastard, but I had done some “research” and felt the need to share. So I began to regale the mythology of Benny Hinn.

Toufik Benedictus “Benny” Hinn is a smarmy mad man that lays claim to special powers of healing given to him by God (specifically, the one from the Bible). He moved to Orlando and founded his first church in 1983, the Orlando Christian Center. That’s right, this jackass opened shop on Walt Disney’s turf. Normally, the idea of someone trying to compete against Walt Disney in a contest of “who’s got a bigger imagination” seems silly and predictable. But no. No. Nope.

but draft beer was not available. I was heart broken. Sorta. Alcohol and miracles do seem to go hand in hand though.

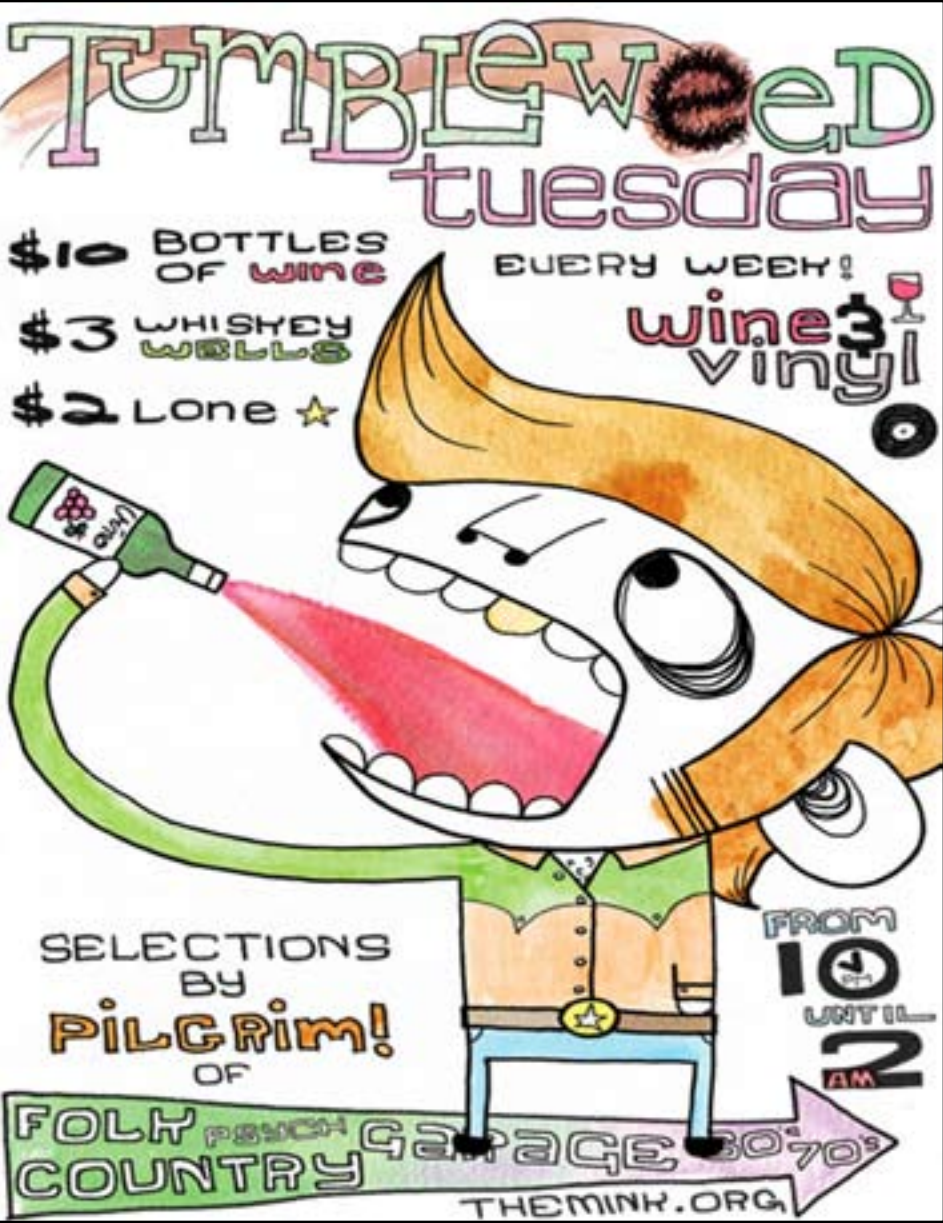
There was a table near the entrance where old women with blue hair were loudly selling books (no Bibles though) and other merchandise used to brainwash all of humanity. Amongst the propaganda was a DVD which assured me that if I believed in God (again, specifically the one from the Bible) and did whatever the DVD commanded me to- then my FINANCIAL CRISIS WOULD GO AWAY. I knew then that I was dealing with liars. Familiar foes of mine. And sometimes not foes at all.

In any case, I left the table and went to look for a seat before any of the old ladies could trap me with the magic they were hiding in their hair. I found a spot halfway up, between a middle aged black woman who was already weeping and a middle aged Mexican woman sitting with her children who were eating cotton candy. I felt very alone.

The air smelled like a thousand different perfumes battling it out to see which one can remind me of church the most.

The service began with songs being sung by a patchwork choir-for-hire (Benny Hinn doesn’t have his own choir because that would require him to pay people money- so he works the sympathy gig and gets the voices for free from different churches around whatever town he’s flown to on his jet). All of a sudden, Benny Hinn appeared in front of the pulpit on the stage. I had no idea what was going on until I saw him. I didn’t understand the mechanics of his show... until I saw him. He was clad head to toe in white- like a klansman almost. He sported tannish ostrich skin dress slippers with his white cruise director suit. I won’t lie, he looked godly. They are the ones aiding and abetting this con artist; and getting nothing in return but more lies.

If you ever see a man dressed in white with Bibles in his hands and dollar signs in his eyes- he ain't Jesus.

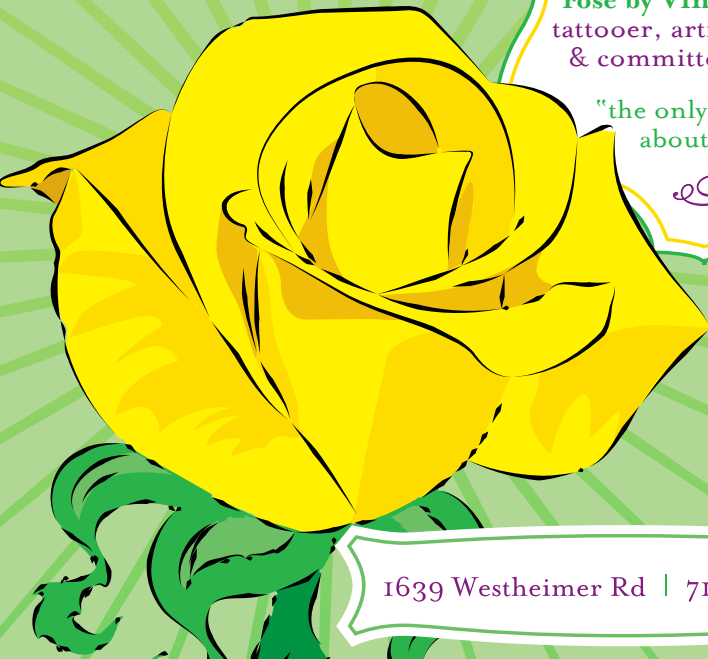

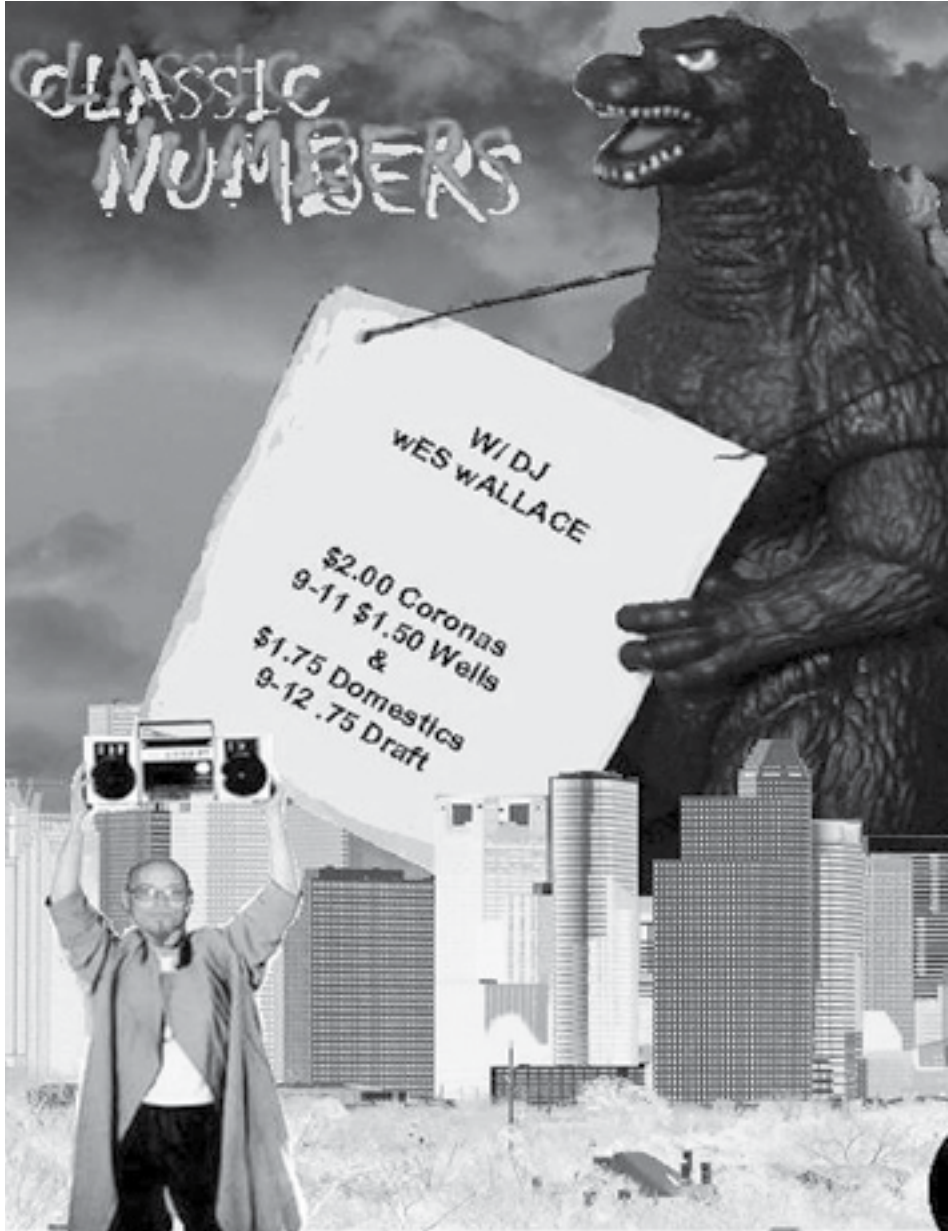

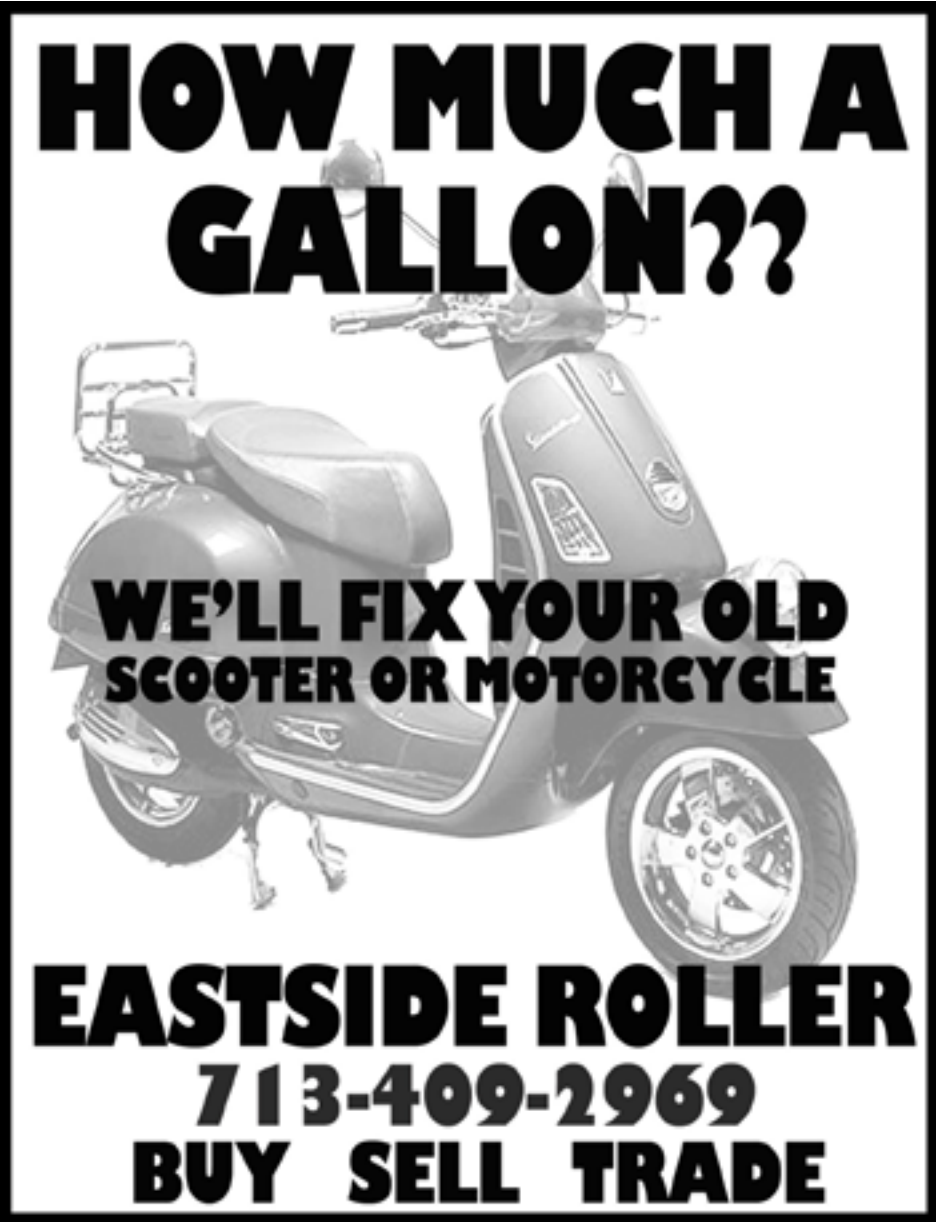

The Innocent Children Of Death Row Inmates

Paige Lynn Wood holds a sign for the crowd to read, "If You Kill My Dad, Jeff Wood, Your Killing Me." Her dad Jeff Wood is scheduled to be executed by the state of Texas on August 2008. Paige was only about 3 years old when her dad was convicted for murder under the "Law of Parties" Statue in Texas for the murder of a store attendant. She is now 14. Her plea for help can be read on a website constructed by Wood's family, "Jeffrey Wood has only one child and that is me. I have been without my father for many years, and I have suffered greatly because of this. I need my father. I need to be able to hug him, and to sit in his lap, and just talk when I need somebody. I have been deprived because of somebody else's crime. Should I continue to be punished? I have has a lot to deal with over these years. I have struggled in school, I have been alone, and I have done it all without my lifeline..my father. Please do not kill him, he did not kill anyone. He is a kind gentle man, and I need him. If you kill him, you are killing me."

Wood was convicted and sentenced to die under the "Law of Parties Statue" in Texas, where you are held responsible for someone else's actions of murder, despite the fact you never touched the gun, never pulled the trigger, or never knew the intentions of your codefendant. Wood's codefendant, Daniel Earl Reneau was executed on June 13, 2003. Last year, Nydesha Foster, then 11 years old, daughter of former death row inmate Kenneth Foster also pleaded for the life of her father who was scheduled to be executed in Texas on August 30, 2007, and also under the same "Law of Parties" statue in Texas. Foster was convicted of murder and sentence to die by lethal injection for a murder that took place while he was seated in the car, quite a distance from the crime. Foster's family and supporters generated thousands of calls to the Governor and Texas Parole and Pardons resulting in a commutation of sentence for Foster. Foster is now serving time in a Texas prison. Wood's case has many similarities to that of Foster's. You can listen to Nydesha's pleas to save her father from execution here.

7/2 Jeff Wood - On Death Row / Law of Parties Conviction

At approximately 6:00 a.m. on Jan. 2, 1996, while Jeff Wood waited outside, Daniel Earl Reneau entered a gas station in Kerrville, Texas, with a gun and pointed it at Kris Keeran, the clerk standing behind the counter. Reneau ordered him to a back room. When he did not move quickly enough, Reneau fired one shot with a 22 caliber handgun that struck Keeran between the eyes. Death was almost instantaneous. Proceeding with the robbery, Reneau went into the back office and took a safe. When hearing the shot, Wood got out of the car to see what was going on. He walked by the door and looked through the glass. Then he went inside, and he looked over the counter and ran to the back, where Reneau was. Wood was then ordered, at gun point by Reneau, to get the surveillance video and to drive the getaway-car.

Jeff Wood was convicted and put on death row, despite not committing murder, under the Law of Parties. Texas is the only state in the nation with such a broad "Law of Parties", allowing the government to execute people who have not committed murder, with around 80 people on Texas Death Row (according to the Austin American Statesman). "My cousin was the person killed by Danny, not Jeff. I say this as a family member who realized long ago Jeff had no part in my cousin's murder and he shouldn't be executed. It's insane to kill another person who did not kill Kris. The video showed Jeff took no part in it. Jeff was one of my friends growing up and someone I think deserves a chance. If he didn't kill him, why should we kill Jeff? This is ridiculous." - Amanda Smith, Cousin of Murder Victim Kris Keeran - June 19, 2008

Please contact Governor Perry and the Texas Board of Pardon and Pardoles on behalf of Jeff Wood. Jeff was charged under the Law of Parties and was not the shooter in this crime. The actual shooter in this case has already been executed by the state of Texas.

7/11 Grand Jury No-Bills Joe Horn

A Harris County grand jury no-billed Horn two weeks ago, enraging many in Houston's African American community as well as many others of all nationalities throughout the metropolitan Houston area. The two men gunned down by Horn were Afro-Colombians. Today, the speakers berated the racism that is systemic in Harris County's criminal justice system and demanded that Horn's shooting be taken before another grand jury, one that is made of of all nationalities. 7/2 Community Mobilizies to defend Day Laborers

Wednesday July 2nd, around 30-40 people met at the Shell gas station at the intersection of Westpark and highway 59 to protest against the support given by the folks in charge of the gas station to member of the facist group "US Borderwatch," who in the past have intimidated day laborees who work hard every day. With Chant of "Racists,Go Home!" and "Si se puede, si se puede", and the precence of 5 HPD Patrol Cars, the people gathered there demonstrated the there will continue to be support for the workers and that they will respond to any threat or provocation of racist groups.

6/30 Sweatshops message to Presidents Doorstep

UH Students Against Sweatshops and allies from the Green Party, the Houston Peace and Justice Center, Rice and Houston Community College attended a demonstration at UH Chancellor Renu Khator's house at 1505 South Boulevard in the museum district. SAS wanted to remind UH Chancellor / President Renu Khator's house her decision about signing on to the Designated Supplier's Program (DSP) is due. In March Khator appointed an "apparel task force" and told SAS and the public that their recommendation was due to her by the end of June at the latest. The task force was made up of 5 faculty members, 1 staff and 1 student. The faculty members have never published in the field. Faculty members who have published about globalization and child labor were kept off the "task force." Khator has thus far ignored the student government resolution to sign the DSP. She has also ignored the entire shared governance procedure which showed that the Faculty Senate and Staff Council did not object to signing to DSP.

6/29 ICE Raids detain more than 150 workers

MORE than 80 community members and organizations congregated in front of the Federal Building today to denounce the Raid that occurred yesterday at a clothing factory. Today was a success because with this action we are able to show Houston and ICE that we will not stay quiet in the mist of all of these raids which are splitting up families and leaving children without mothers. There will be many more actions like this and as always I thank all of you who came out today in the fight for social justice. Whether there are 10 or 100 people present we must never stay quiet and we must always say that there are those Houstonians like us that will continue to fight for social justice.? As long as their is life their is hope! Around 2 dozen people gathered Saturday Morning at the Houston Processing Center, an immigrant detention facility run by the private corporation Corrections Corporation of America, to protest the raid. Many folks parked on the north side of Greens road, and the protest took place on the south side, right next to the facility, making for quite a spectacle on a busy 2 lane road in north Houston.

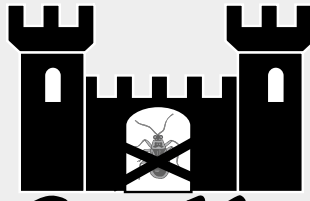
7/18 Field Hearing Examines injustices in Harris County Law Enforcement

Friday Morning at 10am, dozens of community members, activists and victims of the criminal "justice" system came to Houston's City hall to attend, testify and support the field hearing of the House Judiciary Committee looking into Crime, Justice and Race in Harris County. Congress People Sheila Jackson Lee of Houston and John Conyers of Detroit chaired the events and were joined by Texas State Legislators and members of Houston City Council.

They invited people to testify, including The District Attorney of Dallas County who has been trying to reform the office and has began retesting DNA evidence of folks convicted by the office, thus far freeing 8 innocent people. There were also number people who are victims of the Harris County Sheriffs office and other local agencies, including Sean and Erik Ibarra who recently won a 1.7 million dollar settlement from the Sheriffs office following being beaten and facing manufactured charges by the Sheriffs office in 2002. Also the Children of Margarita Savadrea who died in Harris County Jail after not receiving medication to treat her diabetes. The audience was extremely supportive and frequently broke into applause and cheering in support of those giving testimony. Some people were able to bring signs into the hearing reading: "Houston we have a problem" and "Time to Clean House".

Mike Huckabee, a former Republican candidate for president saying “That was Barack Obama, he just tripped off a chair.
